ANGLICAN CURSILLO of CALIFORNIA RE-ORGANIZED

During this past year the Anglican Secretariat has looked at its organizational structure through a series of strategy and planning meetings focusing our efforts on how we do things within the Anglican Cursillo Movement of California. The process included looking at The Cursillo Mission; the Cursillo Strategy; the Health & Well-Being of the Organization; and how we might better achieve the Cursillo goals.

The Cursillo Mission is to help Christians learn and live what is fundamental as a Christian, and to help these same Christians discover and live out a personal vocation. This is done within the Cursillo Strategy which is PRE-CURSILLO, 3 Day WEEKEND, and the FOURTH DAY. All three are vital in order to achieve "the mission of Cursillo". Through the years we have tended to concentrate primarily on the Weekend as our major focus and the importance of the other two, especially the Fourth Day, took a back seat. This needed to change and we have moved in a direction that we feel will better enable us to give equal emphasis to all the various aspects of Cursillo.

Attached is a chart of our new structure. We are divided into 4 different "Servant Communities" (Pre-Cursillo, 3 Day Weekend, Fourth Day, and Administration.) Each is responsible for specific tasks. Each will serve as the "action angels" to get the "work of Cursillo" accomplished. The Secretariat will serve as the "legal" body of the Anglican Cursillo of California with a designated membership. The Secretariat will no longer serve as what some call a "committee of the whole". They will work to support the Servant Communities and accept recommendations and ideas from them that can be formally put into policy and practice. In order to empower the work of the Servant Communities the Secretariat will only meet every other month allowing time for the Servant Communities to do their work in the other months. Issues brought before the Secretariat will be assigned to the appropriate Servant Community to discuss, study, and make recommendations. Each Servant Community will be lead by a "saint" who will oversee the work of that servant community. The four major servant communities may

divide into a smaller sub units if they so choose. These communities may evolve into a 4th day group of people with similar interests and skills that will have a specific task in addition to working and praying in fellowship together. Our plan is to include more involvement and participation from all Cursillistas in smaller tasks so that no one is overburdened. All those who have participated in a 3 Day Weekend will be asked to

become involved in some fashion through a Servant Community. As the Bible tells us, each has been given certain gifts and talents. We are called upon to use these “gifts/talents” in service to others. Once we made our Cursillo, practically all of us have stated that we wanted to give back what we had so warmly received. Many have done this by working a Weekend. However, to keep the Cursillo Movement going it will take more than that from each and every one of us. Christ never stops working for us – how can we do less?

*In 2004 just over 106 Cursillistas completed an Involvement/Participation form (we called it “Commitment”) indicating how they were willing to get involved in more than just working on a Weekend team. We have over 700 of you on the mailing list. WE NEED YOU! (As the old saying goes – “many hands make light work”.) In the January 2005 issue of Footprints you will receive the **2005 Involvement/Participation Form**. Please pray about this. Think about how Cursillo has made a difference in your life, and how you might now serve others through the Cursillo Movement. Complete this form and return it to us right away. (It also serves to help us update our records and database as many things change in a year’s time.) All that we are requesting is something from everyone and not just much from a few. Please pray about this.*

Also, over the course of this past year, new by-laws were adopted, new policies and operational procedures have been put into place, and guidelines were written for scholarships, palanca, the shepherd’s ministry, and sponsor’s training to name just a few. This fall we are activating a Clergy Relations Task Force to meet with the clergy and develop a partnership program, seek ways to work closer with local congregations, and to update our clergy database. Frank Casillas has agreed to chair the Clergy Relations Task Force. Each Servant Community will continue to work on those tasks and issues that come under its jurisdiction.

We see this as the dawn of a new day for the Anglican Cursillo of California. It promises to be exciting as well as rewarding. We encourage you to take your place on the Cursillo train and do your part.

2006 RECTOR/RECTORA DISCERNMENT SET

WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 3, 2004
is the date set for the discernment of the 2006 Rectors and Rectoras. It will be held at St. James Episcopal Church in Oakland beginning at 7:00 p.m. If you are interested in participating in this process and meet the guidelines to serve in this leadership capacity please contact Dick Brown, our Lay Director.

The purpose of the discernment process is to discern who the Rectors/as will be for the 2006 Three Day Weekends. This process promotes longer range planning for Rectors and Rectoras. The Spiritual Directors of the Secretariat are responsible for facilitating the discernment process. At the discernment meeting, the Lay Director of the Secretariat is responsible for insuring that all present have a clear understanding of the duties and responsibilities of a Rector/a.

The pre-requisites or guidelines for being a Rector/a are as follows:

1. Having worked on a 3 Day Weekend as a rollista, a cook, and a member of a Core Team, **OR** previously served as a Rector/a.
2. Attended Leadership Training within the past year **OR** agree to attending one prior to the 3 Day Weekend you serve as Rector/a.
3. A participant in a 4th Day sharing group.
4. A participant in local and Grand Ultreyas.
5. Accept the responsibility of participating in Secretariat and/or 3 Day Weekend Servant

Communities from the time of discernment until one year after the completion of your 3 Day Weekend.

6. Being an active member of a local church congregation.
7. Not having been a Rector/a in the past five (5) years.

Letters of invitation will go out in September to those who are on the "Farm Team" list (basically those we have record of being qualified).

HOWEVER, this list might not be accurate and up to date so you are encouraged to contact Dick if you would like to participate.

The discernment process is not something to be afraid of. It is done with love and support for all those who attend. **It is NOT a COMPETITION!** After prayer, reflection, and sharing, those present determine who they feel the Lord is calling to serve at this particular time. I personally have participated in several discernment gatherings, and each time came away knowing that the Lord had made the right decision. I approached the entire process with the attitude that I am willing to serve if called, but I won't feel hurt if it is not my time. The Lord has many, many things He would like us to do.

Hope to see a large number of you on November 3rd if not before.
